Whilst on her feet, Adjoa has appeared at a wide range of hearings in the magistrates' court, including first appearances, case management hearings, trials, and sentencing hearings. She

has defended in matters of driving, stalking/harassment, and theft. She has also appeared at the Crown Court, defending clients at PTPH, sentence, pre-trial reviews, and mentions.

Adjoa also has experience of professional discipline and fitness to practise cases as she frequently presents cases on behalf of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC).

Prior to starting pupillage, Adjoa worked as a paralegal in the regulatory department of Hickman and Rose Solicitors. She specialised in cases involving the Financial Reporting Council, the Financial Conduct Authority and the Serious Fraud Office. She also assisted in complex and high-profile financial crime and regulatory work.
